# Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish

A deacon and his wife, a seminarian,

catechists, lectors, musicians, sacristans, extraordinary ministers of holy Communion, ushers, members of Respect Life Ministry, Catholic Women's Circle, Bereavement Ministry, Sacred Hearts Society, First Saturday Marian Devotion and Holy Trinity Prayer Group, food pantry, Samoan Ministry, Filipino Catholic Club, Knights of Columbus, Media Group, church cleaners and Parish Pastoral Council practically all ministries and parish groups were represented in a retreat/ workshop March 5 at our parish. Fifty participants came, most of whom currently serve in more than one ministry. They came to watch six segments of the video "The Universal Call to Holiness" by Franciscan at Home, a catechetical institute of Franciscan University at Steubenville. Franciscan at Home is a diocesan resource for lay ecclesial ministry formation and certification. When asked about the take-aways from the retreat/ workshop, Michael Leonardo-Pila, an usher and member of the parish pastoral council, said "it allowed me to reflect on the things that I do on a daily basis and made me realize that if we trust in God, he has a plan for us." While wife Aileen, a catechist and lector, added that "in our Lenten journey to strengthen our relationship with God, we realize the desire is mutual. As we seek him, he also seeks us." Their daughter Emily, a lector and catechist assistant, understood that "God will call us individually, but wants us to respond as a community," and son Joshua, also a lector and catechist assistant, added that "when we look for God in the simple things, we begin to see that he is everywhere in our daily lives." Other comments from participants included "Holiness is doing those things that please God, walking with God in his ways, avoiding temptation and obeying God's words," by Cora Yahiku, lector and member of Sacred Heart Society. Catechist **Susan Marbella** said "the retreat is a time for us to reflect and recollect our own calling. It is the time for us to answer the call of our Lord and our goal is to be with him in his Kingdom." Eleanor Ragojo, a catechist and extraordinary minister of holy Communion, said that "Christ's call to holiness means that we are in the process of growing in intimacy with him." **Sonny Santos** from Respect Life Ministry said that "holiness is one universal word to describe God's utmost love for us throughout all his wonderful creations and all the blessings we receive in our life." Ana Dumlao, the leader of First Saturday Marian Devotion and Holy Trinity Prayer Group, stated that "holiness is serving God and all the people around you with happiness, gratefulness, humility and a 100 percent love which could only be achieved through God's grace and through the intercession of Mama Mary and St. Joseph." # Immaculate Conception Parish

Grand Knight Manny Meno Council 6734 with the Hawaii Chapter of Knights on Bikes represented by its vice-president Jose Rafael Nater-Ro**driguez**, brought the Silver Rose to our church March 5 and 6. On both days, parishioners of, including many children from the parish religious education program, participated in the Silver Rose Prayer Service. Here is a brief history of the Silver Rose: Our Lady of Guadalupe did so much for her people in Mexico that, in 1960, the Columbian Squires, a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus, wanted to give something back to her. The group of young men in Council 2312 in Monterrey, Mexico, had the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the miracle

of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The first rose was a natural rose blessed by Bishop John C. Cody of London. It was then flown to New York where it was received by Grand Knight Joseph Thomasen who took it to Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart. Mr. Hart then shepherded the rose to Dallas, Texas. There, Texas State **Deputy Jack Collerin** received the rose and took it to Laredo, Texas, where it was finally given to the Squires from Monterrey, Mexico, at the International Bridge in Laredo. They ran the rose from the International Bridge through Sabinas Hidalgo, Mexico, to Cienega de Flores and on to the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico, on Dec. 12, 1960. After the March 6 service, the catechists reiterated to the children that the Silver Rose was started by children their age and no matter how old you are, if you Love the Lord, anything can happen. Council 6734 and the Hawaii Chapter of Knights on Bikes pray that other councils and parishes, will request a visit from the Silver Rose. (Reported by Normand HJ Robert)
