# St. Theresa School

A little gem is hidden in the passage-way behind the sanctuary of the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa Church. The well-lit but narrow walkway has been transformed into a museum honoring the patron of the church and school: St. Theresa of Lisieux, the Little Flower. Hung on the walls are large posters that highlight her life, each lovingly framed by Father Dominic Nguyen. The handmade wooden frames and simple floral decorations designed by Sister Mercy, SPC, and her Liturgical En-


vironment Ministry, beckon visitors. A cell phone will unlock the QR codes created by Ms. Faith Leasiolagi attached to each display. Once activated, a narration and videos commence to recount the significance of each exhibit. Ms. Leasiolagi and Mrs. Ashley Agcaoili provide the voices of virtual docents. Both ladies did extensive research before composing the narrated reflections. A life-size model of St. Theresa that adds the saint's presence to the museum was gifted by Deacon Ray and Tyra Lamb. Embark on this pilgrimage and immerse yourself in the life St. Therese. The brainchild of **Father** Manny Hewe, pastor of St. Theresa Parish, the gallery was completed one year after the idea was conceived. Surprised students and faculty of the school were invited to be the first to tour the museum as part of their celebration of St. Theresa, during the week of Sept. 26-30. ## Saint Louis School

Over 175 years since our founding as a Catholic mission school, we have grown from a school for Hawaiian men to an established Catholic Marianist institution of learning for Ha-

waiian men. Beneficiaries of a roval land grant of Kamehameha III, and rooted in a faith-based stewardship of land, culture and people, our learning institution continues to serve as the only K-12 all-male school in the Hawaiian Islands. This unique story has captured the attention of organizers

of the World Indigenous People's Conference on Education who have invited a group of educators from Saint Louis School to make a special presentation at their annual event held in the Adelaide Convention Centre in Australia. Being selected to present at this global conference is a first-ever privilege for our school, and through the generosity of donor and former chair of our school Board of Trustees, Robin Yoshimura '76, five members of our faculty and administration and a former student and parent are sharing our story among over 300 workshops under the theme of "sovereignty, voice, youth and futures."
