### St. Joseph Parish

Two hundred youth from the Pacific islands of Hawaii, Saipan, Guam, Palau and Kiribati, along with over a half-million other young people from all over the world, left their homes this week to greet the Holy Father and celebrate their Catholic faith at World Youth Day in Lisbon Aug. 1-6. At our parish, in preparation for their departure, 25 youth spent July 22 in prayer, culminating in a joyful celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. The next day, their pastor, Father Edison, gave the pilgrims a departing blessing during the Sunday morning Mass. They flew to Madrid, Spain, to join other Pacific islanders, and will go by train to Lisbon to see the Holy Father on Sunday, Aug. 7. The following day they will meet with youth from the many Neocatechumenal Communities of Europe, Asia, Africa, Oceania and the Americas, where the initiators of the Way, Kiko Arguello, Father Mario and Asuncion will greet them. Two days later they will travel north to Santiago de Compostela, the end of the Way of St. James, in Spain with more than 8,000 youth and catechists of the Neocatechumenal Way from the United States. Noah Alo, 18, of Makawao, who just graduated from Kamehameha High School, said he is going on this pilgrimage "because I want to have an encounter with Jesus Christ and hope to receive some direction as to my vocation in life."
