He highlighted the gestures of both priest and assembly. Small group sharing offered participants an opportunity to reflect on what they learned. Holy Thursday Mass is at 7 p.m. **Good Friday** Stations are at 5 p.m. Veneration of the Cross is at 7 p.m. Easter Vigil Mass will be at 7 p.m. at St. Roch. Easter Sunday Mass will be 8 a.m. at St. Roch and 10:30 a.m. at St. Joachim Church in Punaluu. There will be an Easter egg hunt for the children, with lots of prizes, on the grounds of St. Roch following the 8 a.m. Mass, along with fellowship in the parish hall. We continue with meditation every second and fourth Wednesday at St. Roch 3-5:30 p.m. "It is a time of silence and individual prayer for it is in the silence that we hear God's voice." ... Our new
